# Art of forward-looking!

BELIEVE it or not, there're those who enjoy reading during the festive season.

And *Start With The End in Mind* is a book to take with to your holiday destination.

One thing about this book, it has a lot to offer to entrepreneurs.

It's well written and easy to understand – minus the business jargon.

According to the author, Jamal Sahib, balance is important in life – because he insists, “you can't divorce your approach to life from your approach to business”.
